Whether you have been a member of Maps for 25 years or 25 days, you might wonder how you can access your funds after hours or if you leave town.



At Maps, we have the tools you need, both technological and human, to make sure you get the help you need when you need it.

Online Banking

The Maps website lets you access your account anytime, day or night. You can check your history, deposit checks, send or receive funds from another financial institution, or pay bills. The bill payment feature is an especially powerful tool. It allows you to receive your bills directly in online banking, schedule your payments manually or automatically, and avoid long lines at the post office to buy stamps.

In addition, you can access FinanceWorks to manage your budget. FinanceWorks integrates all of your accounts, no matter how many financial institutions you use. Import all of your account information into this secure online budgeting tool. Then benefit from a visual representation of where your money goes and alerts to upcoming events, such as your payroll deposit or a regular bill that will soon be due.

ATMs

This year, Maps will be updating its branch ATMs to take your cash and check deposits without the hassle of deposit slips and envelopes. The drive-up and walk-up ATMs at the administration building and most branches will be replaced over the course of the coming year, and most will have the new deposit capability.

If you use an ATM at night or on the weekends, please ensure that you are aware of your surroundings and that you shield your PIN entry from others around you.

Text Banking

If you haven't tried Text Banking yet, you are missing out. You can sign up on the web (textbanking.mapsco.com/) or at any branch. Then all you have to do is text simple commands to 40293 to check your balance, transfer funds between accounts, and see recent transactions.

Text banking works on any cell phone that has text message capability, and it is free. Your wireless phone plan may include charges for text messages, so make sure you check with your carrier to see if they levy any charges.

Mobile Apps

Members who prefer to use their iPhone or Android phone to access their accounts can download the Maps app from either iTunes or the Android Marketplace.

It gives you access to your funds and your online bill payment functionality with an interface that is designed

especially for the mobile screen. You can also locate the nearest Maps branch or ATM to your current location with the GPS features on your smartphone.

Shared Branching

Traveling out of the area or heading off to college? Access your Maps account at one of 6,700 credit union branches in the United States and Canada through shared branching. The staff of the credit union you visit will offer you the same great service you get at any Maps branch, and you can deposit, withdraw, and make loan payments. You will need a photo ID and your Maps member number to access your accounts at the shared branch.

Private Line

Use any touchtone phone to get basic account information, transfer funds, make loan payments, and do other business with Maps. Call 503.588.7100 or 800.677.7100 and enter your member number and Private Line PIN. You can get a menu of Private Line services at any branch, by calling our Salem Contact Center at 503.588.0181 or 800.688.0181 ext. 3811, or on our website.

If you have never used Private Line before, you will need to call our contact center and get a temporary PIN to access the system.

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Savings Bonds Go Electronic

You may have heard that savings bonds are now available directly from the U.S. Treasury electronically.

The Treasury is committed to offering electronic savings bonds in Series EE and I bonds as an investing strategy and a gift, so you will be able to buy them and gift them at treasurydirect.gov. Treasury Direct is available 24/7, making it an easy way to purchase and store your bonds.

"Savings bonds are very much a part of this country's history and culture, and will remain a part of America's future — but in electronic form," said Public Debt Commissioner Van

Zeck. "It's time for us to take a 1935 model and make it a 21st-century investment tool."

Ending over-the-counter sales of paper savings bonds at financial institutions is a continuation of the Treasury's all-electronic initiative announced in April 2010. It is estimated to save the government \$70 million over the first five years.

To receive a bond as a gift, the recipient will also need to have an account with Treasury Direct. Treasury Direct includes special accounts for minors that allow them to store and catalog their bonds, so you will still be able to give bonds as gifts to your children, grand-



children, and other minor family members.

"Through Treasury Direct, investors have an easy and convenient way to purchase and manage their bonds free of charge," Commissioner Zeck said. "Investors will no longer have to worry about misplacing, losing or storing paper savings bonds."
